The 2021 Wadden Sea Day will focus on the achievements of the Wadden Sea Flyway Initiative since it was launched in 2012, its role in international conservation, and the state of bird populations on the East-Atlantic Flyway. Most importantly, views from scientific and conservation projects along the flyway together with future perspectives for the Wadden Sea Flyway Initiative will be discussed.

The designation as World Heritage site by UNESCO is a recognition of the Wadden Sea's crucial importance and responsibility for the conservation of migratory birds on a global scale. Upon request by UNESCO, the Trilateral Wadden Sea Cooperation (TWSC) aims to strengthen cooperation on management and research activities with States Parties on the African Eurasian Flyways, which play a significant role in conserving migratory species along these flyways.

Invited are policy-makers, conservation managers, scientists and non-governmental organizations working in the field.

Due to the Sars-Cov-2 situation, it was not possible organising the Wadden Sea Day in 2020. For 2021, we plan to organise a physical meeting. However, in case the Sars-Cov-2 situation does not allow for a physical meeting, the Wadden Sea Day will be organised as a virtual meeting. We will continue to monitor the Sars-Cov-2 developments and keep you informed about the status of the Wadden Sea Day.
